## **#IWMC2025** – Record Attendance expected for CPDaccredited 24th International Water Mist Conference

**Hamburg, 17<sup>th</sup> July 2025.** The final programme for the 24th International Water Mist Conference (IWMC) has now been released, and the International Water Mist Association (IWMA) is pleased to announce that pre-registrations indicate the largest number of participants ever.
